Arkansas' most decorated Olympian, Veronica Campbell-Brown, spent a short but successful year in Fayetteville that culminated in an NCAA title and collegiate record.

"Veronica is a great ambassador for Razorback nation and the sport of track and field," Arkansas Razorback women's track and field head coach Lance Harter said. "Not only is she extremely talented but she is humble and hardworking. That is a unique combination and she is greatly admired for how she handles competition on the track and life off the track. Her success is well deserved."

She was the 2004 NCAA Indoor Champion at 200 meters and was named an All-American four times. At the SEC level, she won three individual titles. She earned All-America accolades for the 60 meters, the indoor 200 meters, the indoor 4x400-meter relay and the 4x100-meter relay.
